The vision of AIRS is to provide residential services, quality care, and support for people living with HIV/AIDS. Their greatest mission is to enhance the lives of low-income individuals and families living with the disease. They aim to create comfortable, caring, and safe environments where their residents can receive essential supportive services, thus enabling them to be contributing members of their community with an enhanced quality of life.

The AIRS Family Program provides housing and support services to families affected by HIV/AIDS in the Baltimore metropolitan area. The Program offers a high level of support to the families in order to make life with HIV-disease as stress free as possible, so that the families can focus on staying well and staying together. The Family Program Team consists of a Program Manager, Case Manager, a Family Focus Worker, and an Educational Mentor. The NDA member functions as the Educational Mentor.

Member Duties:

- Coordination of after-school study program with children in the AIRS Program.
- Provide tutorial assistance to adults in the AIRS Program who may be returning to school.
- Assist the Community Outreach Coordinator and Family Focus Worker in planning and implementing educational activities.
- Assist in recruiting and supervising volunteer tutors.
- Offer life skills training to families to enhance their abilities and make them successful individuals in their communities.
- Assist parents in developing techniques to help their children with homework.
- Any other duties assigned by Family Program Manager.
- Organize recreational activities for the families throughout the year, linking the activities to education and learning.

Qualifications:

- The NDA member needs his/her own car and AIRS reimburses miles driven for work.
